SVOSH President's Symposium 2017 Atlanta, Georgia

The leadership of VOSH/International looks forward to gathering with our SVOSH chapter leaders and thanks National Vision for providing the funding and location for our leadership retreat.

The meeting will start with the history of V/I, how V/I has grown, share the makeup of our current 88 chapters internationally, and introduce our current Board of Directors and committee members. Thoughts on how students can become more involved with V/I will be discussed, with specifics on the V/I student intern program, featured chapter of the month, student reception at the AOA and Academy meetings and the agenda of the annual meeting.

We will discuss the public health issue of uncorrected refractive error globally and our relationship with and support of the WCO, IAPB, BHVI, OGS and others in supporting global initiatives. Our current committees will be discussed, with details on the V/I Technology Transfer program, VOSH Corps, and our emphasis for 2017 on data collection and reporting and the importance of this regarding public health.

Leadership skills will be addressed with the SVOSH Chapter presidents. The various chapters will be asked to present details of their chapter-how they are structured, participation, fundraising, qualifying for a clinic, participating in The World Sight Day challenge, and other chapter experiences will be discussed for participants to learn from each other.

What makes a VOSH clinic successful? Best practice guidelines will be explored with the students on the logistics and details for a successful clinic, both domestic and abroad. Testing, necessary equipment, supply of glasses, host expectations, travelers insurance, available funding and equipment from outside sources will be explored. Details of the SVOSH mentorship where SVOSH domestic chapters mentor optometry students in other countries during a joint clinic will be explained.

At the end of this meeting, SVOSH representatives will return to their schools with a better understanding of VOSH, how best to motivate and manage their SVOSH chapter, the global issue of uncorrected refractive error, and best practice guidelines for a successful clinic.
