


### The WHO Competency-based Refractive Error Teams (CRET) is available now

The Competency-based Refractive Error Teams (CRET) Handbook was unveiled alongside other technical tools during a World Health Assembly side event called *“Eye Health Has 2030 In Sight: New Data, New Resolution, New Momentum”*. CRET is an adaptation of WHO’s *Eye Care Competency Framework (ECCF)* and provides a structured approach to developing effective teams that deliver quality care for refractive error. 
## Special issue on Global Optometric Education
