Supporting optometric education in Lebanon

Our friend, Dr Yazan Gammoh, chair of the World Council of Optometry education committee, Professor Vanessa Moodley, South Africa, and Dr Lina Hawat ran a workshop on Optometry Curriculum Standardization Quality and Assurance Lebanese government university officials and other eye care sector stakeholders. The workshop was a collaboration with the Department of Optics and Optometry at the American University of Science Technology (AUST) and the Vision Care Association (VCA), supported by a WCO educator grant. Attendees discussed the ethics in the health care system, the situation of optometry education in the MENA (Middle East and North Africa) region, and social accountability in optometry education. We look forward to hearing more about this important work.
