### 2023 VOSH/International Awards open for applications


Every year VOSH/International recognizes volunteers who have excelled in their humanitarian work. VOSH/International chapters are encouraged to send nominations by August 25 for:

### SVOSH-MCU-the Philippines Pediatric Eye Care Project

SVOSH-MCU together with the Optometry UNICEPS conducted its first in person seminar since 2020 entitled Eye Care Seminar: Eye Dos and Eye Don'ts for 63 Senior High School students from STEM 11-1 and 11-2, and some Optometry students. The seminar raised awareness about optometry, refractive errors, eye care tips and more.

In June and early July, this chapter in collaboration with

MCU College of Optometry, MCU UNICEPS, Junior IPAO MCU Chapter, IPAO CAMANAVA Chapter, and Know the Glow MCU Chapter, held a Pediatric Eye Care Project in 3 public elementary schools in Caloocan City. They provided free comprehensive eye examinations to 500 Grade 1 students and also catered for 84 senior citizens including some people with disabilities.

While in Vietnam for a non-VOSH work visit, our Executive Director visited the schools of optometry in Hanoi and Ho Chi Minh city. In Hanoi, a productive meeting with Prof. Pham Trong Van, Head of the Ophthalmology Department and Minh Anh Tran, head of the school of



optometry was followed by an enlightening visit to the school and its vision clinics. Minh Anh Tran is the 2019 IAPB Eye Health Hero Award in recognition of her leadership role in developing optometry in Vietnam and a great asset to the school in Hanoi.

At the University of Medicine Pham Ngoc Thach in Ho Chi Minh City, a meeting was held with Dr Quang Tri Trinh, head of the

optometry department, Dr Lori Kopilevitz, lecturer and VOSH volunteer based in Vietnam and other members of the Vietnamese team. In both meetings, discussions focused on ways that VOSH/international could support both schools through our specific programs.
