Research grants allocated

The Education Committee received 14 complete proposals. The following four proposals were selected to receive a grant of \$2000 to implement the selected project.

- **-SVOSH-KNUST Ghana** Dietary Carotenoids on Cognitive and Vision Health of School Children in Ghana.
- **-SVOSH-IMSU-Nigeria** Evaluation of Ocular Signs of Onchocerciasis (River blindness) in Selected Rural Communities in the Imo River Basin, Imo State, Nigeria.
- -SVOSH-AAU-Jordan- Evaluation of the effectiveness of training schoolteachers to conduct vision screening for schoolchildren in Jordan.
- -SVOSH-AreaAndina-Colombia- Beginning to See the World

The Education Committee will organize training in 2024 to support the development of proposals for the 2024 call. Watch the space.
